Starting school

Back to school is an exciting time for students and families. It can be a big step – particularly for those starting prep. Here are some tips on how you can help your child have a positive start to school. The Department of Education shares the following tips to support children starting prep.

During the summer holidays

- Show your child where the school is and talk about how you will get there.
- Arrange play times with other families whose children will be going to the same school. It helps if your child knows another child at their school at the start of prep.
- Practise the things your child will need to do to get ready for school (e.g. putting things in their bag, remembering to take a hat).
- Confirm your before or after school care arrangements and explain these to your child.
- Be positive about starting school and enjoy your child's excitement.
- Visit your local library and read books with your child about starting school.

The first day of school

- Make sure your child knows who will take them to school and pick them up on the first day.
- Help your child to organise their clothes, hat, shoes and socks the night before.
- Help your child to pack their school bag with a snack, drink, lunch and a hat.
- Place a spare pair of underpants and a change of clothes in a plastic bag. Let your child know these clothes are in their bag in case of any accidents at school.
- Put sunscreen on your child in the morning if it's needed.
- Show your child where you will meet them at the end of the school day.
- At the end of the day talk to your child about what happened at school.

While your child is settling in to school

- Many primary schools have a buddy system for Prep children. They will partner your child with older students. This is to help your child have a welcoming experience from the very beginning.
- Find out about what your child is learning at school. By doing this, you can support your child's learning and find out how your child is adjusting to school.
- If your child is having difficulty at school, talk to their teacher. Your child can also say what they think might help them.
- Keep talking to your child about school. Ask them about their new experiences, what they like and what they find hard.
- If your child goes to care before or after school, find a way of sharing your child's school progress with the staff.
- Share feedback about your child's experience of starting school with the school and early childhood service.
- Organise time for your child and their new friends to play together outside of school.

We are excited that Northern Schools Early Years has been appointed as the provisional provider for two new Kindergartens on School Sites (KOSS) being built by the Victorian Government: Gladstone Views Kindergarten (opening in 2026), and Sunbury College Kindergarten (interim name, planned to open in 2027).

We are looking forward to partnering with these two schools to bring our award-winning Kindergarten to Grade-6 model to new communities, so that even more children and families can benefit from our early learning programs! Huge thanks to the Victorian Government and the Victorian Schools Building Authority for providing this opportunity.

Toy Library Grant for Roxburgh Park Primary School Kindergarten

We are excited to share that NSEY has received a grant to set up a new Toy Library at our Roxburgh Park Primary School Kindergarten!

The Victorian Government is investing \$1.9 million over 4 years to establish 8 new toy libraries and support existing toy libraries across the state.

Our new Toy Library will be available to the kindergarten and school families as well as the broader community, helping to support children's learning and development at home.

What's happening at NSEY (continued)

NSEY team at the Early Childhood Australia Conference



NSEY is committed to investing in professional learning for our staff, and this includes opportunities to attend national conferences such as the Early Childhood Australia conference, which was held in Perth this year!

Five our our management and kindergarten team members attended this year (pictured from left to right - Bec H, Linda, Bec C, Yara and Parastoo). The conference theme was "Universal not Uniform: Leading change, strengthening unity and honouring individuality" and featured so many incredible speakers. Topics of note were the use of digital technology in early learning, children's literacy development, exploring challenges for the EC workforce, supporting educator wellbeing and much more.

An update on Child Safety reforms in early childhood

In repsonse to the shocking cases of child abuse in child care that have been revealed in recent months, there have been significant child safety reforms introduced in Victoria and nationally, with key changes coming into effect in late 2025 and early 2026. These include:

- Reforms to the Working With Children Check (WWCC) and Reportable Conduct Scheme are underway.
- The timeframe for approved providers to notify the regulatory authority of any incidents or allegations of physical or sexual abuse is reduced from 7 days to 24 hours.
- Service environments must be free from the use of vaping substances and vaping devices
- Services must have a policy and procedures for the safe use of digital technologies and online environments, and only authorised devices can be used when children are present. For NSEY, this means that parents are not permitted to use phones or other devices within the service.

Child safety is the single most important part of the work we do, and we take it extremely seriously. Our staff receive regular training and support to ensure the safety of all children attending our services, and we act swiftly to investigate and take action when concerns are raised, in line with our Child Safety and Wellbeing Policy and our Complaints and Grievances policy (which you can find on our website, https://nseyc.org.au/policies/).
